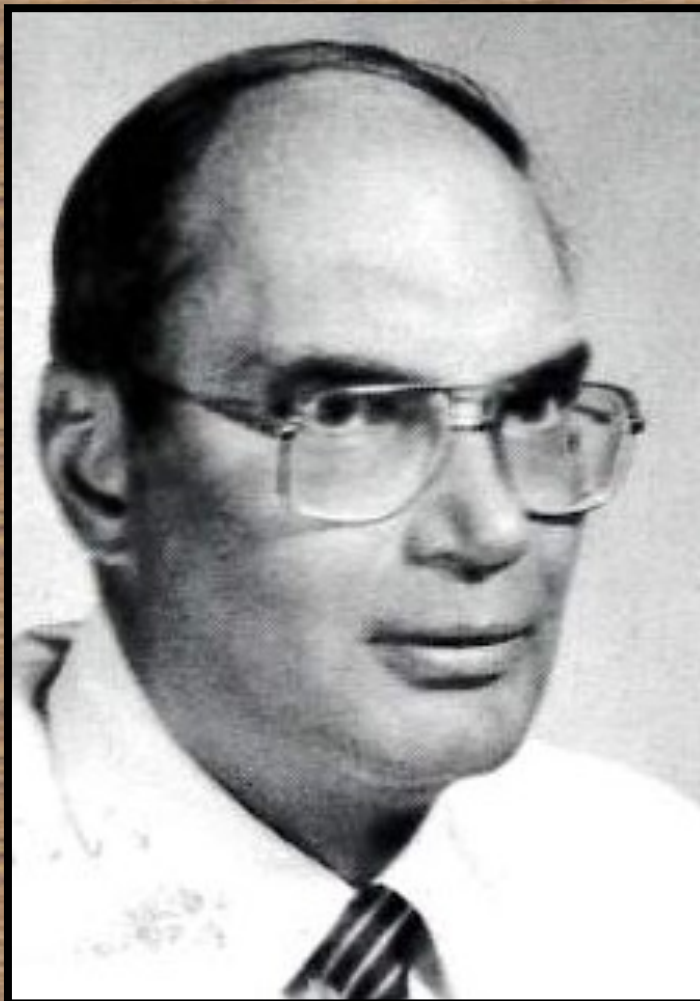


## ST. THOMAS MORE HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI HALL OF FAME

Tom Glyzewski graduated from UW-Milwaukee in 1962 and began his high school teaching career in 1963 at Dominican High School. In 1965, he became one of the inaugural math teachers at the “new” Pio Nono and he continued at Thomas More until his retirement in 2002. Even in retirement, he was a frequent substitute teacher until he passed away in 2007.

Tom is universally renowned by his students for making math understandable. Hundreds of students came back after their first semester of college to report that their math classes were simple thanks to the preparation that Tom provided in his classes. His dry sense of humor and knack for explaining complex concepts inspired students to pursue careers in both teaching and math-related fields. Students marveled at his ability to draw a perfect circle on the chalkboard and they knew that he would call them to the board at any time to work out a problem. He cared about every student and demanded excellence from them, as well.

Tom always made it a point to go to sporting events that did not draw many fans because he Tom felt that those student-athletes deserved support, too. His legacy lives on through his successful former students, and he is not forgotten at St. Thomas More.
